I'm recording myself drawing at 10 fps, and I've tried importing it in on auto fps, 24 fps, etc. but none of that seems to help when I try to speed up the video. No matter how little I try to speed it up, it gets really choppy and jumps from scene to scene without showing the small details. Is this normal, or am I just doing something wrong?

Hello,
Speed up can make playback choppy. When this starts to happen depends on the amount of acceleration, computer power, video format, and complexity of edits. If it happens even with slight acceleration, below 800%, your computer is under powered or you video format too demanding, maybe both. The problem is (should be) fixable either by using the internal proxy workflow, described here , or by converting prior to import to an edit-friendly format.
Could you post your computer details (OS version, Lightworks version, CPU, RAM, GPU, HDD) and a Mediainfo report, please?
